- The Tianjin Project offers accredited Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Hospitality and Tourism Management at Tianjin University of Commerce (TUC)
- Largest international education cooperation between China and the U.S.
- Establishing a new 340,000 sq. ft. campus
- The Asian Globalization and Latin America (AGLA) project focuses on points of intersection between the regions of Asia and Latin America
- Examines issues such as migration, identity, trade, education, and technology, with an emphasis on contemporary society as part of a comprehensive investigation of the significance of globalization affecting all regions
- Funded in part from a Department of Education Title VI grant
