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



First RNP backbone (1991)
















Metropolitan high speed networks







- separate budget
- telecom costs directly paid by
- the Science & Technology ministry
- ~ 12 million dollars/yr

- most visible action of RNP
- We have all the badwidth we need (or all that we can use) most of the time.
- more than 300 institutions





Inter state conectivity:

- Total bandwidth adds to 250 Mbps
- POP's operated by partnership agreement with some customers (mainly federal universities)
- Presently based on leased ATM VP's from a major telco (most of them heavily used)





External conectivity:

- •155 Mbps to global Internet (US ISP) 60% used
- •120 Mbps of traffic exchange (peering points) with brazilian commercial ISP's
- •45 Mbps to AmPATH + "Internet2" (65% used)







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RNP government programme



- funding for Information Society related projects and activities
- "Informatics Law": lower taxes for computer industry that invest in related research
- •RNP is one of the possibilities
- Variable amout of \$\$\$, from 2 to 5 M\$
- Mostly as equipment

- •4 M\$ budget this year
- •6M\$ in 2003
- About 50 people

"Promoting the innovative use of advanced networking in Brazil."


Problem: we must know better our clients; we must know better about their usage of the network.
