

Background

Hurricane Mitch - October 1998

- 9,000 killed; 13,000 injured; 3 million displaced
- \$5 billion in damages
- Crippled
 - Economic and social lifelines
 - Health and communication services
- U.S. Support
 - Over \$900 million



Background (cont.)

Earthquakes in El Salvador

- Earthquakes in January/February 2001
 - Over 1,000 killed and 4,000 injured
 - Many health facilities destroyed
 - Nearly \$3 billion in damages





- Each site received a server, router, UPS, Ethernet switch, laser printer, scanner, and two PCs


